

## ITINERARY & SIGHTSEEING

### Day 1

Crossing the Confederation Bridge, the red cliffs confirm you've arrived! Count how many potato fields you see on the way to Cavendish Campground in Prince Edward Island National Park. Stroll down to Cavendish beach to dip your toe in the Atlantic Ocean for the first time.

### Day 2

Put on your bathing suits and head to Cavendish beach for the day. Check out the Discovery Dome and reach into the Touch Tank: pick up a jellyfish, cradle live clams and hold a wriggling live lobster. Spend the rest of the day relaxing, swimming, flying kites and building sandcastles.

### Day 3

Head to nearby Green Gables Heritage Place to embark on an adventure through the storied landscape. Using clues and imagination, help track down Anne and bring her back to safety.

Cap off your afternoon with some shopping and a savory ice cream cone in the village.

### Day 4

Head to Brackley Beach and rent a 4-wheeled Coastal Cruiser to cycle the seaside path in shaded comfort or pack up your own bicycles to make the trek. Will you make it to the Covehead lighthouse?



### Day 5

Grab a shovel and bucket and head to Brackley Beach where a renowned local artist crafts majestic masterpieces out of sand, and shows you the tricks of the trade. Soon your family will be building spectacular forts and towers!

### Day 6

Head home knowing that sandcastles may wash away with the next tide, but your sensational memories will not.



## ITINERARY & SIGHTSEEING

### Day 1

**Arrive Deer Lake (via air) or Port aux Basques (via car ferry)**

Drive north to Gros Morne National Park. (66 km/334 km)

### Day 2-3

**Gros Morne National Park**

Enjoy the Western Brook Pond Boat Tour. Feel the mist of scenic waterfalls spilling over 700m cliffs that rim this glacially carved lake.

Take a guided tour of the Tablelands, a geological wonder – a rare piece of the Earth's mantle exposed.

Spend a day enjoying coastal walks or hike challenging and adventurous routes to the top of Gros Morne's mountains. Meet local residents and share in their stories and music at one of the many lively concerts, plays, or festivals.

### Day 4

**L'Anse aux Meadows National Historic Site**  
(376 km)

Are you fascinated by Vikings? Visit the only known Viking site in North America and discover your inner Viking. Meet resident "Vikings" who share their skills and stories and bring the Viking age alive.



### Day 5

**Red Bay National Historic Site**  
(217 km)

Take the short ferry trip to Labrador. Visit a 16<sup>th</sup> century Basque whaling station, once the largest whaling port in the world. Meet the "ghost" of a Basque sailor who'll share tales of the life of a whaler.

### Day 6

**Gros Morne National Park**  
(356 km)

Return to Gros Morne and head to Lobster Cove Head and enjoy an epic sunset. Visit Port au Choix National Historic Site.

### Day 7

**Depart Deer Lake or Port aux Basques**  
(66 km/334 km)

Next time? Take in the beauty of Eastern Newfoundland.

### Day 2

90 km to Cheticamp

Stop at the Visitor Centre. See the exhibits and get information.

Stay in an oTENTik or in an all equipped campsite for hassle-free comfy camping. Don't miss the breath taking Skyline Sunset Hike.

### Day 3

Travel over 100 km of rugged, wave-pounded cliffs and sheltered coves on the breathtaking journey in Cape Breton Highlands National Park. Every turn inspires a photo!

Spend the night in Ingonish. Stay in an oTENTik or a resort. Kids not tired yet? Take them on the guided Lantern Walk Through Time or Seeing in the Dark tour.

### Day 4

Start off your day on the right foot. Golf at the famous Highland Links Golf Course, spend time kayaking or enjoying the beach.

*Drive to Louisbourg 145 km*

En route, stop at local artisan shops. Sleep in a cozy B&B or local inn.



### Day 5

Spend the day at the Fortress of Louisbourg. Help garden, taste rum or fire a canon. Learn what life was like 300 ago from authentically-clad "residents." Enjoy an 18<sup>th</sup> century style lunch in a period restaurant.

## Fort Edward

National Historic Site

Enjoy the commanding views over the Annapolis valley as you explore the grounds and the cannons. See if you can find graffiti left by 18<sup>th</sup> century soldiers in the oldest surviving blockhouse in Canada.

## Grand Pré

National Historic Site

Located in the heart of a UNESCO World Heritage Site, this was the epicentre of Acadian culture. Pack a picnic and your camera and immerse yourself in a landscape of French willows, flower gardens and orchard trees.

## Fort Anne

National Historic Site

Work up an appetite by climbing and rolling down the earthen walls of this star-shaped fort or by playing a game of croquet. Don't forget your kite – the breeze is perfect here!

4

## Port-Royal

National Historic Site

Learn a Mi'kmaw game inside the wigwam, try on some wooden shoes and climb up to the artisans' quarters. Then relax while you take in the panoramic views – you'll see why Samuel de Champlain chose to settle in this place.

5

## Kejimikujik

National Park and National Historic Site

Spread your blanket at the beach, or if you're thirsty for adventure, hop in a canoe and head to a secluded island. Take a break in one of the equipped shelters after a hike or a good run at the playground.



Golden sand dunes, estuaries brimming with life, warm ocean beaches, Mi'kmaq and Acadian culture, the starry spectacle of a Dark Sky Preserve and snowbound winter activities weave together the compelling tapestry of Kouchibouguac National Park.

## The Wild Side



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**Mighty Moose**

I bet you've dreamed of spotting this mythical creature in the wild. At 2 metres in height, it's the largest of our antlered mammals. This king of the forest can be seen in our national parks across the country, however populations are abundant in Gros Morne and Cape Breton Highlands national parks.

**Salmon**

Salmon found in the inner Bay of Fundy are a unique population of Atlantic salmon. They relocate to their native rivers by scent. A species at risk, they cannot be fished (or eaten!). However, you can join us at Fundy National Park and Snorkel with Salmon for Science.

**Turtle Crossing**

Upon your arrival in Kejimikujik National Park, you will be greeted by many road signs featuring turtles. No one knew that the Blanding's turtle even existed in Nova Scotia until 1953. They're considered a relic from a time when the climate was warmer. How many of the park's 3 species of turtles can you spot during your stay?

**Splashing Seals**

In Sable Island National Park Reserve, you'll find the largest colony of grey seals in the world. Although quite unbalanced on land, they are very agile in the water. Weighing in at up to 450 kg and measuring up to 3 metres in length, we guarantee you'll be blown away when you spot them in Kouchibouguac National Park.

**Lobster**

A relative of the shrimp and crab, our 10-legged friend can live up to 50 years or more. However, it must shed its shell in order to grow. Although found in the waters of all of the Atlantic Provinces, the largest one was caught off the coast of Nova Scotia. Imagine a 40 lb lobster on your dinner plate!

Give these animals the space they need. Your responsible behaviour contributes to the survival of wildlife – and your own safety!

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
