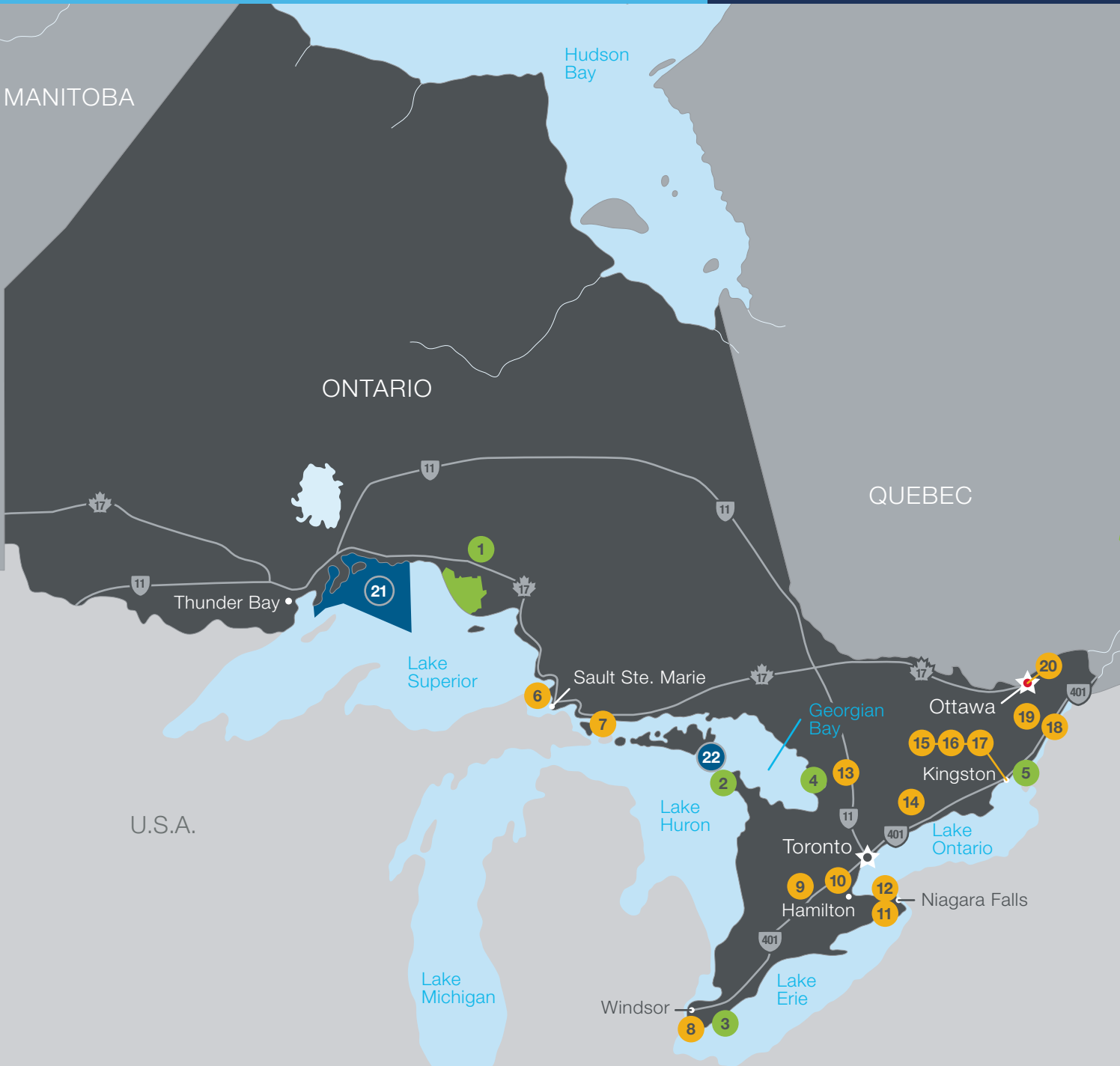

Pukaskwa National Park

1 Pukaskwa



Pukaskwa National Park's exceptional beauty is revealed in its vistas of Lake Superior and in the rugged, ancient landscape of the Canadian Shield and northern forest. Pukaskwa is Ontario's largest national park, protecting 1878 square km of boreal forest and the most pristine shoreline anywhere on the Great Lakes. Home to Ontario's most remote backcountry trail, the Coastal Hiking Trail, the park also offers car campers unparalleled solitude and privacy at Hattie Cove Campground.

2 Bruce Peninsula



In the heart of a world biosphere reserve, 'the Bruce' protects one of the largest pockets of wilderness remaining in Southern Ontario. It boasts spectacular shoreline cliffs gazing out at Georgian Bay, crystal clear turquoise water, sinkholes, ancient coral reefs and sea caves.

3 Point Pelee



A lush Carolinian forest oasis, the park resounds with the songs of migrating birds in the spring, hums with cicadas in the summer, flutters with Monarch butterflies in the fall, and is a peaceful place of reflection in the winter. The small but extraordinary park juts out in to Lake Erie at the southernmost point of mainland Canada.

4 Georgian Bay Islands



Discover the iconic Canadian landscape of Georgian Bay Islands National Park. Located in the world's largest freshwater archipelago, the 30,000 islands, it is at Georgian Bay Islands National Park that you will discover spectacular landscapes, time-worn rock faces, diverse habitats, the rugged beauty of the Canadian Shield and cultural history dating back 5,000 years. 5 Thousand Islands



The rocky islands, windswept pines, and cool waters of Thousand Islands National Park have the flavour of the northern wilderness just a few hours from Toronto, Montreal, and Ottawa. Majestic castles and historic summer homes stand in contrast to rugged islands of granite and pine in this world-renowned region. Park islands are a haven for boaters, paddlers and campers, and they offer a special island camping experience with oTENTik accommodations. The park's visitor centre features live animals, fun activities, scenic picnic spots, and oTENTik accommodations in a riverside setting.

6 Sault Ste. Marie Canal



Nestled beneath the International Bridge, the canal features a recreational lock, historic buildings, trails, and a unique Emergency Swing Dam. Opened in 1895, the canal completed an all-Canadian waterway and featured the longest lock in the world. Visitors may explore the trails, view wildlife, fish the rapids, enjoy a picnic, watch the boats lock through, and investigate the captivating displays in the Visitor Centre. Enjoy the site at your leisure or join an expert interpreter on a guided site tour.

7 Fort St. Joseph



Situated on the north shore of Lake Huron, Fort St. Joseph is known for its role in the War of 1812. It served as the base for the first British military manoeuvre against the Americans with the taking of Fort Michilimackinac. Once the most westerly outpost of British North America, Fort St. Joseph was a thriving community of British soldiers, Aboriginal people and fur traders in the early 1800s. Today, visitors can wander among the ruins of the fort, enjoy a picnic on the grounds, explore the Visitor Centre and walk the nature trails.

8 Fort Malden



Fort Malden has been an army garrison, British Indian Department post, dockyard for the Upper Great Lakes, and the meeting place for Chief Tecumseh and British General Brock during the War of 1812. Explore this British empire outpost.

9 Woodside



Woodside is the boyhood home of William Lyon Mackenzie King, Canada's longest-serving prime minister. Set in a stunning urban park, the 1891 home reflects the comforts middle-class families like the Kings enjoyed. Have a picnic, take photos, stroll the paths, and discover the significance of Woodside to Mackenzie King and his family.

10 HMCS Haida



HMCS *Haida* is one of 27 Tribal class destroyers built for the British, Canadian and Australian navies. Of these 27 ships built, 13 were sunk and 13 were scrapped - *Haida* is the sole survivor. Tour the ship, hear stories, and experience what life was like on-board.

11 Queenston Heights



The Battle of Queenston Heights took place in October of 1812, when an American invasion force was defeated. The battle was instrumental in contributing to the development of Canadian national consciousness. Since then, the 'Heights' have been enjoyed by generations of nature lovers, hikers and history enthusiasts alike.

12 Fort George



Nestled within the picturesque town of Niagara-on-the-Lake, Fort George is located along the scenic Niagara River. A key strategic point, the British headquarters at Fort George was the focus of a number of American attacks during the War of 1812. Come and enjoy a performance by the internationally renowned Fife and Drum Corps and discover an exciting time when Canada's existence hung in the balance.

13 Bethune Memorial House



Dr. Norman Bethune is the most famous Canadian in the world and still revered today by over one billion Chinese, yet his story is far less well-known in his homeland. Explore the restored 1890 birthplace and the new \$2.5M visitor centre, to uncover clues as to what led a small-town boy to become a renowned battle-front surgeon and how that story nurtured Canada's reputation as a society with a social conscience.

14 Trent-Severn Waterway



The Trent-Severn Waterway is a vast and intricate system of lakes, rivers and canals stretching from Lake Ontario all the way to Georgian Bay. Today, boats travel the 386km waterway thanks to 44 locks, including the world's highest hydraulic lift lock and North America's only marine railway. Less than two hours from the Toronto area, it's ideal for a day or weekend getaway.

15 Bellevue House



Bellevue House, home of Sir John A. Macdonald, Canada's first prime minister, was built in a rare style of Italianate villa architecture. It was one of the first and finest of its kind in Canada. The gardens of Bellevue House are spectacular: they boast ornamental grounds, an heirloom apple orchard and a kitchen garden. Join us for one of our workshops to experience working in the garden as you would have in the 1840's. Hold your special day on the grounds at Bellevue House whether it be a birthday party, family reunion, wedding or anniversary.

16 Fort Henry

17 Kingston Fortifications



The Kingston Fortifications include Fort Henry, Fort Frederick and three additional towers: Murney, Shoal, and Cathcart (please call for hours of operation). Together they defended Kingston and the Rideau Canal from attack. Share the vistas with a massive cannon, take a photo of Shoal Tower rising from the water, or imagine the life of a soldier inside a fort.

18 Fort Wellington



Fort Wellington was built during the War of 1812 to defend the St. Lawrence River shipping route between Montreal and Kingston from attack by the United States. Explore the wreck of an 1812-era gunboat, try on a costume and take part in military drill, witness a cannon firing, savour period treats cooked over an open fire, or play games from long ago.

19 Rideau Canal



The Rideau Canal, Ontario's only UNESCO World Heritage Site, is a chain of beautiful lakes, rivers, and canals winding over 200 km between Kingston and Ottawa. The Rideau Canal is the oldest authentic continuously run canal in North America. This internationally recognized marvel can be enjoyed year-round, by walking, driving, biking, boating, or skating along its route.

20 Laurier House



Laurier House commemorates two of Canada's most notable prime ministers, Sir Wilfrid Laurier and the Rt. Hon. William Lyon Mackenzie King. For over fifty years, from 1897 to 1948, the house occupied a central position in the political life of Canada, as the place of residence of Laurier and, after his death, of Mackenzie King.

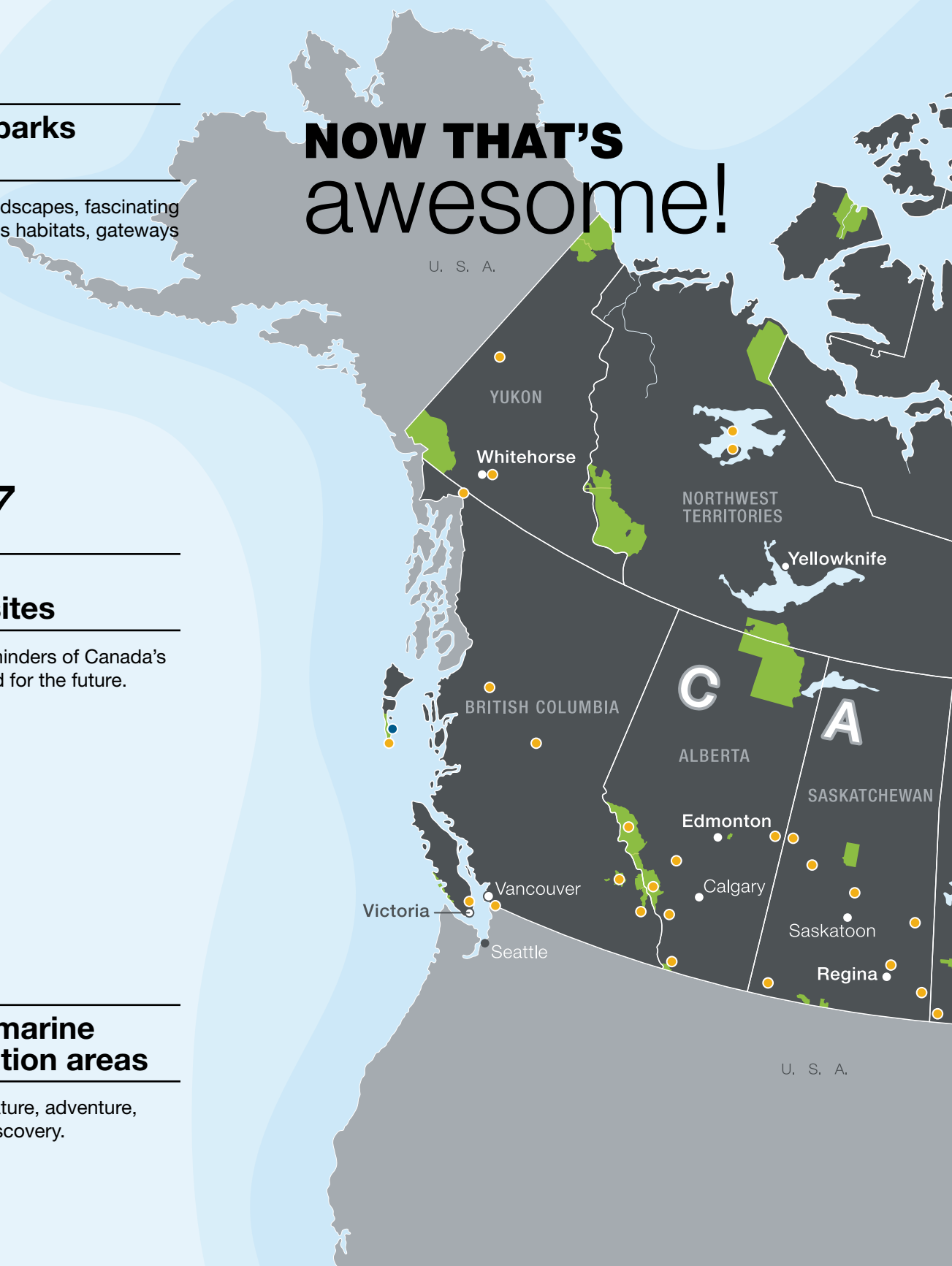

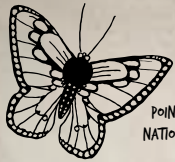

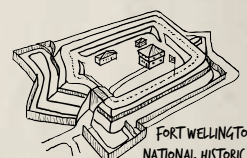
