



ITINERARY & SIGHTSEEING



DAY 1


Thousand Islands National Park, Mallorytown Landing, *136 km from Ottawa*

Escape from everyday life and enter into the heart of the wilderness only a few hours from the city.

Lace up your running shoes and discover different paths that wind through the park on undulating hiking trails. Explore hemlock forests, walk through spectacular wetlands, reach wooded ridges and admire impressive rock walls covered with ferns. Discover a forest changed dramatically by the work of industrious beavers.

Don't forget your binoculars, the park is the ideal place to observe wildlife.

Spend the night in the heart of nature in your comfortable waterfront oTENTik. Stoke up your campfire, roast some marshmallows, take in thousands of stars and just relax...



DAY 2

Wake up to the sound of water lapping the shore. Walk on the wharf, coffee in hand, what a relaxing morning!

Ready for adventure? Grab your kayak and explore the St. Lawrence River's blue-green waters. Visit picturesque granite islands and admire iconic windswept pine trees. You will be fascinated at every turn by sunken ships, historic castles and a landscape steeped in First Nations history.

You might be lucky enough to glimpse a soaring bald eagle or a family of turtles basking on a rock.





DAY 3

Ride the 40 km of paved bike path along the 1000 Islands Parkway and observe its stunning river views.

Take a picnic break on the breezy banks of the St. Lawrence River. In the afternoon, relax by the waterside and take a refreshing dip in the water.

Want to go fishing before dinner? Who knows, with a bit of luck, you will be frying what you caught today!



DAY 4

Prescott, 45 km from Mallorytown Landing

Go to **Fort Wellington** National Historic Site and enlist in the Royal Artillery for a day! Recruits will spend their time training to be a member of the cannon crew. Feel the surge of adrenaline as you fire a 19th century muzzle-loading cannon.

Return to **Thousand Islands** National Park for a final night along the scenic County Rd 2. Stop in Brockville along the way to shop on the main street and maybe pick up a Thousand Islands souvenir.





DAY 5

Kingston, 45 km from Mallorytown Merrickville, 105 km from Kingston

Tour the restored home and gardens of **Bellevue House** National Historic Site, home of Sir John A. Macdonald. Wander through the family's preserved kitchen garden, bite into an heirloom apple and watch costumed gardeners cut the lawn with scythes, just like in the 1840s.

Take a stroll through the charming Kingston streets. Explore the city's defensive system at **Kingston Fortifications** National Historic Site – located by the Kingston Harbour – and discover the defensive heart of Canada's first Capital.

Continue your journey all the way to Merrickville, a magnificent Victorian village along the Rideau Canal. Wander around the historic village and travel through time. Cozy up for the night in an oTENTik by the Rideau Canal.

DAY 6

Ottawa, 75 km from Merrickville

Discover the national capital in a different light! Paddle through the scenic countryside, historic towns and quaint villages of Eastern Ontario on one of the many lakes, rivers or canals that wind through the city. There is so much to see and do along the **Rideau Canal** National Historic Site.

Create your team and join us for a Voyageur Canoe Sunset Paddle in Ottawa on the Rideau Canal!






DAY 7

Take time to explore the canal on foot! It is a perfect activity to immerse oneself in the Rideau Canal's history and nature. Do not miss the lockstation in Ottawa, with its historical flight of eight locks.

On the way back home, stop at **Laurier House** National Historic Site. Enjoy a behind-the-scenes white glove tour: explore rooms usually off-limits to visitors and touch some of the artifacts in the collection. Enjoy afternoon tea served on the veranda before heading back home.

Toronto to Niagara-on-the-Lake



ITINERARY & SIGHTSEEING

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DAY 1

Rouge National Urban Park, Toronto

Looking to escape the stress of everyday life? Come recharge at Rouge National Urban Park! Explore Carolinian ecosystems, discover one of the largest marshes in the region, walk along unspoiled beaches and let the sand soothe your feet. There's nothing like a gentle lake breeze on a hot summer day.

Immerse yourself in a cultural experience and discover a piece of human history stretching back more than 10,000 years, including Aboriginal sites that are among the oldest in Canada.

DAY 2

HMCS *Haida* National Historic Site, Hamilton, 80 km from Toronto

After a good breakfast and a heaping bowl of fresh air, make your way to the Port of Hamilton. Climb aboard the most famous Canadian war vessel and imagine what life must have been like for the crew serving on the Navy's most decorated ship. Can you spot any imminent threats on the horizon?

Enjoy the Hamilton farmers' market where you can pull together a delicious picnic before heading out to Niagara-on-the-Lake.





DAY 3

Fort George National Historic Site, Niagara-on-the-Lake, 75 km from Hamilton

Watch a musket firing demonstration. Better yet, put on a red coat, slip on a military hat, load and fire. Wander through the fort's eight restored buildings and revisit the lives of British soldiers and their families. Enjoy beautiful views of the mighty Niagara River.

Take the rest of the day to leisurely stroll around town on foot or by bike. Make sure to fill your shopping bags with local products before heading back home.





Wild Side



Monarch Butterfly

A Monarch's life begins as an egg laid under a Milkweed leaf before becoming a magnificent butterfly one month later. From the end of August to mid-October, visit **Point Pelee** and see the gathering Monarchs before they head off on their courageous 3000 km journey to the mountainous forests in Mexico.



White Pelican

The American White Pelican is a threatened species in Ontario and is very often seen on the north shores of **Lake Superior National Marine Conservation Area** in Nipigon Bay and Black Bay at Hurkett Cove. This beautiful bird soars above the water and dips its large orange-yellow bill and pouch into the water's surface to catch fish.



Massasauga Rattlesnake

The massasauga is an unusual rattlesnake protected in **Georgian Bay Islands** and the **Bruce Peninsula**. Up to a metre in length, it is solitary, passive and timid, however when threatened, it will shake its tail in warning. Did you know its "rattle" gains a new ring every year?



Stinkpot Turtle

The stinkpot turtle is one of the more secretive turtles found in **Thousand Islands National park**. Due to habitat loss, the stinkpot turtle is a species of special concern. Parks Canada and its partners are currently working on restoring and maintaining shorelines and wetlands; the critical habitat of the stinkpot turtle.



Linear-leaved Sundew

Meat eating plants at the beach! The Singing Sands shore of **Bruce Peninsula National Park** is a treasure trove of plant life, and is home to four types of carnivorous plants. The linear leaved sundew (drosera linearis) uses its sticky leaves to trap and snack on insects to supplement its diet with nutrients it cannot get from the surrounding soil, yum!

Give these animals the space they need. Your responsible behaviour contributes to the survival of wildlife – and your own safety!
