DAY 1

THOUSAND ISLANDS

Mallorytown Landing, 135 km from Ottawa

Escape from everyday life and enter the heart of the wilderness only a few hours from the city.

Lace up your running shoes and discover different paths that wind through the park on undulating hiking trails. Explore hemlock forests, walk through spectacular wetlands, reach wooded ridges and admire impressive rock walls covered with ferns.

DAY 2

Ready for adventure? Grab your kayak and explore the St. Lawrence River's blue-green waters. Visit picturesque granite islands and admire iconic windswept pine trees. Be fascinated at every turn by sunken ships, historic castles and a landscape steeped in First Nations history.

You might be lucky enough to glimpse a soaring bald eagle or a family of turtles basking on a rock.

DAY 3

Ride the Thousand Islands Parkway's 40 km paved bike path for stunning river views. Relax by the waterside and take a refreshing dip in the water.

DAY 4

FORT WELLINGTON

Prescott, 45 km from Mallorytown Landing

Enlist in the Royal Artillery for a day! Recruits will spend their time training to be a member of the cannon crew. Feel the surge of adrenaline as you fire a 19th century muzzle-loading cannon.

DAY 5

BELLEVUE HOUSE

Kingston,

45 km from Mallorytown Landing

Tour the restored home and gardens of Sir John A. Macdonald. Wander through the family's preserved kitchen garden, bite into an heirloom apple and watch costumed gardeners cut the lawn with scythes, just like in the 1840s.

DAY 6

Ottawa, 75 km from Merrickville

Discover the nation's capital in a different light! Paddle through the scenic countryside, historic towns and quaint villages of Eastern Ontario on one of the many lakes, rivers or canals that wind through the city.

DAY 7 RIDEAU CANAL AND LAURIER HOUSE

Take time to explore the Rideau Canal on foot! Do not miss the lockstation in Ottawa, with its historical flight of eight locks.

Enjoy a behind-the-scenes white glove tour at Laurier House. Sip some afternoon tea served on the veranda before heading home.

ROUGE NATIONAL URBAN PARK

Looking to escape the stress of everyday life?

Explore Carolinian ecosystems, see one of the largest marshes in the region, walk along unspoiled beaches and let the sand soothe your feet. Discover a piece of human history stretching back more than 10,000 years.

HMCS HAIDA

Niagara-on-the-Lake, 75 km from Hamilton

Watch a musket firing demonstration. Better yet, put on a red coat, slip on a military hat, load and fire.

Wander through the fort's eight restored buildings and revisit the lives of British soldiers and their families.

Enjoy beautiful views of the mighty Niagara River.

Return to Toronto, 130 km

THE CHALLENGE

How can we measure the health of Canada's protected areas?

Ecosystems respond differently to shocks and disruptions brought about by climate change. Recording data on hundreds of thousands of insect species across Canada's national parks can reveal a lot about the state of these ecosystems.

A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

Volunteers and scientists have found more than 725,000 specimens to scan using the Guelph Centre for Biodiversity Genetics' *Barcode of Life*.

THE RESULT? Scientists now have a baseline to track long-term shifts in species.





Once the longest lock in the world and the first to operate using electricity.

The birthplace of Norman Bethune, a national hero.




