



At Sloop Cove, see signatures carved into the bedrock by the brave employees who worked here. Local operators offer tours and transportation.



Saskatchewan





Explore the West Block's Frenchman River Valley and marvel at unexpected encounters with rare animals and plants. Discover the East Block's astonishing geological formations and rock fossil beds.

Wander through miles of rolling hills and hidden coulees, where the buffalo roam. Catch a glimpse of a burrowing owl or black-footed ferret. Marvel at an active prairie dog colony, or an ancient teepee ring. Don't forget to experience the local-western hospitality.

Camp in deep forests, paddle on pristine waters, visit bogs or go hiking. Travel by canoe or foot to the lakeside cabin of legendary conservationist Grey Owl. See free-ranging bison on their historical home range. Spot a pelican on its way to the only fully protected white pelican nesting colony in Canada. With spectacular views, a charming village, and wild animals all around, the park is sure to offer something for everyone.

Experience life in the 1870s and discover how Fort Walsh presided over one of the most dramatic periods of change on the Prairies. Learn how Canadian law was established in the West, while the Cypress Hills continued to be a meeting place and crossroads for many different peoples, including Mounties, First Nations peoples, Métis, fur traders and whiskey traders.

Fort Battleford



As you walk towards the towering walls of the Fort Battleford stockade, take in the beautiful scenery and think about the dramatic history of the area that resulted in conflict between the First Nations people and the Canadian government in 1885. Discover how more than 500 settlers sought safety at Fort Battleford when conflict loomed. Discover the fascinating stories of the North-West Mounted Police, First Nations people, settlers and militia in these difficult times.

Batoche



Learn how in 1885, Gabriel Dumont, Louis Riel and the Métis took on the federal government in a battle that changed the development of Western Canada. Walk the grounds of the majestic historic village of Batoche. Learn about the extraordinary people and the events that shaped Canada. Celebrate Métis and Aboriginal culture through traditional activities and special events.

Motherwell Homestead



Motherwell Homestead depicts the lifestyles. costumes, and architecture of the early 20th century. Here you can get a glimpse of the life and career of pioneer farmer and politician, W.R. Motherwell, and his significant influence on the development of scientific agriculture in Western Canada.

Manitoba





Let this land fill you with awe as you visit the remote subarctic wilderness that protects one of the world's largest known polar bear denning areas, where female bears give birth. Approximately 900 polar bears inhabit this huge 11 475 square kilometer park. As a nature lover, watch for arctic foxes, arctic hares, wolves, caribou and wolverines as well as 250 bird species. Access to Wapusk is via authorized commercial tour operators in Churchill.

Experience 3000 km² of prairie grasslands, boreal forest and aspen parkland by exploring the 400 km of trails! Take part in superb wildlife viewing and bird watching. 9 Riding Mountain Park East Gate Registration Complex

See the historic log work of the East Gate, built in 1933 to accommodate early auto tourism and promote interest in outdoor leisure pursuits. Satisfy your curiosity; note the iconic Rustic Tudor architectural style of Canada's earliest national parks. A must-see on your list! This building was designed by Swedish immigrants using local building materials. It is the last of many original entrance gates left standing in the Parks Canada system.

Inside this restored Red River Frame house, you can reflect on the fascinating and complex story of Louis Riel and explore his modern legacy. Come to Riel House and learn about Riel and the Métis, a distinct Canadian people with a unique blend of French and Aboriginal traditions.

12 St. Andrew's Rectory



St. Andrew's Rectory is an excellent example of mid-19th century Red River architecture. Outdoor exhibits interpret Red River architecture, and the roles of the Church Missionary Society and the Church of England in the settlement of the Red River and Western Canada.

13 Lower Fort Garry



Walk among the stone walls and buildings that tower above the Red River at Lower Fort Garry. Hear the ring of hammer on metal, savour the aroma of bannock drifting from an aboriginal campfire, or feel the coarse fur of a bison hide. Connect to history with the help of skilled costumed interpreters at this restored 19th century Hudson's Bay Company fort. Explore the multi-media interactive Visitor Centre exhibits, a perfect introduction to the historic grounds.

14 Prince of Wales Fort



Seek the thrill of adventure in Churchill Manitoba... Canada's accessible arctic...and see the astonishing Prince of Wales Fort built 250 years ago on the bare, windswept coast of Hudson Bay. Get a real sense of a fur trader's life in the sub-arctic at this massive stone outpost. Hop on a boat to the fort and experience unforgettable whale watching - more than 3,000 beluga whales gather in the Churchill River in July and August.


