CAMPING IN THE NATIONAL PARKS

The National Parks of Canada provide splendid opportunities for pleasant vacations under canvas. For visitors who bring along their own camping equipment, and for those who arrive in cabin trailers, camp-grounds in easily accessible locations have been laid out and equipped by the National Parks Branch. Most of these camp-grounds are provided with kitchen shelters, stoves or fireplaces, tables, benches and sanitary arrangements. In many of the larger camp-grounds, trailer parks with electrical plug-in facilities and water connections have been developed. Other modern camp-ground equipment includes community buildings, outdoor film screens, refrigeration buildings, service buildings containing wash-rooms and laundry facilities, dressing-room buildings for bathers, wharves and pavilions. In several of the National Parks these camp-grounds are close to the townsites and to all park recreational facilities. Usually there are stores nearby where provisions may be purchased.

Campers who are not equipped with cabin trailers should bring along tents, canvas cots, blankets, cooking utensils, and perhaps a few camp chairs. Some provisions should be carried to last until the visitor can get to the nearest store.

The normal season for camping in the National Parks is from June to the end of September, but this varies somewhat according to the locality.

Camp-fires may be kindled only at places provided for the purpose, and must be completely extinguished before campers leave the site. Persons camping out overnight more than one mile from a park highway, where no regular camp-ground facilities are available, must have a permit to light a camp-fire. They must also first register with the nearest park warden.
