
Children's Activity

What <u>Not</u> to Do in a National Park

1. Feeding wildlife; 2. Fire outside the firepit; 3. Loud music; 4. Picking flowers; 5. Capturing insects; 6. Squashing insects; 7. Leaving garbage around; 8. Leaving smelly foods out that attract wildlife; 9. Carving in trees; 10. Putting nails in trees; 11. Breaking tree branches or destroying plants; 12. Pouring waste water into lakes or streams.



Important Notice for Camping Permit Holders

The camping permit holder agrees to observe all campground rules. Failure to do so may result in the camping permit being cancelled with loss of fees paid, and the camping permit holder may be charged under the *Canada National Parks Act* and regulations.

It is understood that if Park staff observe unattended bear and other wildlife attractants, they may enter and inspect my campsite. It is further



understood that these bear and wildlife attractants may be removed to an appropriate storage area to enhance the safety of the public and reduce the risk to wildlife.

Bear and wildlife attractants may include:

- coolers
- food (opened/closed)
- garbage
- wrappings
- dishes and pots

- bottles and cans
- any item associated with the preparations of food.
