Hot springs, wildlife and scenery will wow you along the Miette Road.

Start your day at the Pocahontas Cabins. Walk the 20-minute trail to a long-lost coal mine. Pocahontas miners blazed a trail to Miette Hot Springs and built the first log pools in 1919.

- Admire the canyon at Punch Bowl Falls.
- Keep your camera handy—wildlife may surprise you along the 17-km drive to the hot springs.
- Marvel at the massive wall of limestone and take in the scenery from Ashlar Ridge Viewpoint, just 8.5 km
- Hungry? Bring coals for a BBQ at the hot springs picnic area or have a tasty meal in the cafe.
- ••••••••••• For breathtaking panoramas, include the **Sulphur Skyline** hike in your plans (8 km round trip).

Kootenay road trip Highway 93S

It once took a whole day in a Model T Ford to drive from Banff to Radium Hot Springs when Kootenay National Park's road opened for touring and transporting goods. Today, make the return trip in a day and stop to enjoy these terrific places:

- Stand on the Continental Divide—the point from which water flows to two different oceans. Stroll the 0.5-km Fireweed Trail and discover how fire renews forests
- Energetic? Hike the amazing trail of fire and ice to Stanley Glacier (3 hours / 8.4 km round trip).
- View Marble Canvon's deep carved chasms and gorgeous turquoise waters from seven different bridges.
- Stroll along a 2-km trail to the **Paint Pots**, a First Nations cultural site. Enjoy these three iron-rich mineral springs that
- Keep your binoculars ready! Along this route you may see deer, bears, goats, wolves and bighorn sheep.
- Admire breathtaking views of the Mitchell and Vermilion ranges from the Kootenay Valley Viewpoint.
- Look up at the towering red cliffs of the Redwall Fault in Sinclair Canyon.
- Get out your swim suits and relax in the Radium Hot Springs pools before you check out the village.






BASK IN OUR WARMTH

Hot springs form when water seeps kilometres deep into the earth, where it is heated and pressurized. The water flows back to the surface, laden with sulphate, calcium, bicarbonate, magnesium, sodium and other minerals, ready to soothe and relax you.

Sacred to First Nations peoples and treasured by settlers, the hot springs of the Canadian Rockies continue to rejuvenate generations of travellers.

The earliest hot springs pools were made of gravel, logs and mud. Today's facilities feature the best mineral water treatment available, ensuring that public health and environmental standards are exceeded.





Against a backdrop of magnificent alpine scenery, this splendid, historic spa and bathhouse has it all. Soak in the steamy hot pool where travellers have come to "take the waters" for over a century. Day spa, gift shop and cafe with outdoor terrace on site.

HERITAGE SUITS Slip on a heritage swim suit (for rent) and take a fun photo to send to family or friends.

LOCALS' TIP During busy holiday periods, visit early in the day for the most peaceful experience.

ROAM While in Banff take the Roam bus to the hot springs.

Water volumes from the natural spring may fluctuate during winter. During periods of reduced flow, the pool may be topped up with heated municipal water. These are infrequent and advisories are posted when this occurs.



Jasper National Park

You won't soon forget the drive up the spectacular Fiddle Valley to the hottest mineral springs in the Rockies. Flowing from the mountain at 54°C, the water is cooled to a comfortable temperature of 40°C as it enters one of the two hot pools. Peaceful surroundings that will inspire you to explore.

FIDDLE VALLEY CAFE No need to pack a lunch, sit down for a freshly made meal and enjoy the slow life! A cool delicious ice cream or cappuccino awaits you.

CAMPSITES AND CABINS Plan to come for a few days, there are places to stay in the area.

Gaze up at the rock cliffs of Sinclair Canyon from the spacious mineral hot pool and see if you can spot one of the bighorn sheep that make this canyon home. Kids will love swimming and diving in the cooler swimming pool (29°C) while adults can kick back in the hot pool.

ART SHOW See the park through the eyes of an artist during the glass art show from May 21 to October 10, 2016. Stunning stained glass panels interpret the park for visitors.

CAMPING Bring a tent or rent an **oTENTik** at Redstreak Campground. From here you can ramble down the forest trail to the hot springs.

WINTER Heavily frosted trees and rocks, glittering snowflakes and steam rising off the hot water-a visit here is wonderful at any time of year!
