

# Ultimate day in Jasper **Miette Road**

Miners from the town of Pocahontas blazed a trail to Miette Hot Springs and built the first log pools in 1919. Today, the 17-km road is the ultimate place for sightseeing and wildlife viewing.



Admire the canyon at Punch Bowl Falls.

Keep your camera handy-wildlife may surprise you along the 17-km drive to the hot springs.

Marvel at the massive wall of limestone and take in the scenery from Ashlar Ridge Viewpoint, just 8.5 km up the road.

Hungry? Bring coals for a BBQ at the hot springs picnic area or have a tasty meal at the Fiddle Valley Cafe.

Discover how hot springs are formed and touch Miette's source on a gentle stroll along the Source of the Springs Trail. Or get your heart beating and enjoy breathtaking panoramas of the Fiddle Valley on the Sulphur Skyline Trail (8-km return trip).

Top off your day with a marvellous soak in **Miette Hot Springs!** 

# Kootenay road trip **Highway 93S**

It once took a whole day to drive from Banff to Radium Hot Springs in a Ford Model T. Today, the drive takes less than two hours and there are plenty of stops to enjoy along the way.

Stand on the Continental Divide—the point from which water flows to two different oceans. Stroll the 0.5-km Fireweed Trail and discover how fire renews forests

Energetic? Hike the amazing trail of fire and ice to Stanley Glacier (3 hours/8.4 km round trip).

Stroll along a 2-km trail to the Paint Pots, an Indigenous 3 cultural site. Snap a photo of the three iron-rich mineral springs that stain the earth red.

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
Deer, bears, goats, wolves and bighorn sheep all call Kootenay home. Keep your binoculars ready and learn how Parks Canada is helping wildlife cross the highway safely at the Dolly Varden day-use area.

Admire breathtaking views of the Mitchell and Vermilion ranges from the Kootenay Valley Viewpoint

Look up at the towering red cliffs of the Redwall Fault in Sinclair Canvon.

Relax in the Radium Hot Springs pools then check out the Village of Radium Hot Springs.

The earliest hot springs pools were made of gravel, logs and mud. Today's facilities feature the best mineral water treatment available, ensuring that public health and environmental standards are exceeded.

Sacred to Indigenous peoples and treasured by settlers, the Canadian Rockies Hot Springs continue to rejuvenate travellers from around the world. As you enjoy the mountain scenery, take a moment to relax and soak in our natural warmth.

# **Miette Hot Springs Jasper National Park**

You won't soon forget the drive up the spectacular Fiddle Valley to the hottest mineral springs in the Rockies. Flowing from the mountain at 54°C (129°F), the water is cooled to a comfortable temperature of 40°C (104°F) as it enters the two hot pools. Enjoy peaceful surroundings that will inspire you to explore.

FIDDLE VALLEY CAFE No need to pack a lunch, sit down for a freshly-made meal and enjoy the slow life! Finish off your visit with a delicious ice cream or cappuccino.

**CAMPSITES AND CABINS** Plan to come for a few days. there are places to stay in the area.

**Banff Upper Hot Springs Banff National Park** 

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Set against a backdrop of magnificent alpine scenery, this splendid, historic bathhouse is not to be missed! Soak in the steamy hot pool where travellers have come to "take the waters" for over a century. Gift shop and cafe with outdoor terrace located on site.

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**HERITAGE SUITS** Slip on a heritage swimsuit (for rent) and take a fun photo to send to family or friends.

**LOCALS' TIP** During busy periods, visit early in the day for the most peaceful experience.

**ROAM** While in Banff, take the ROAM bus to Banff Upper Hot Springs.

Water volumes from the natural spring may fluctuate during winter. During periods of reduced flow, the pool may be topped up with heated municipal water. These are infrequent and advisories are posted when this occurs.




# **Radium Hot Springs Kootenay National Park**

Gaze up at the rock cliffs of Sinclair Canyon from the spacious mineral hot pool and see if you can spot one of the bighorn sheep that make this canyon home. Kids will love swimming and diving in the cooler swimming pool (29°C) while adults can kick back in the hot pool.

**CAMPING** Bring a tent or rent an **oTENTik** at Redstreak Campground. From here you can stroll down the forest trail to the hot springs.

**WINTER** Heavily frosted trees and rocks, glittering snowflakes and steam rising off the hot water-a visit here is wonderful at any time of year!
