BANFF NATIONAL PARK

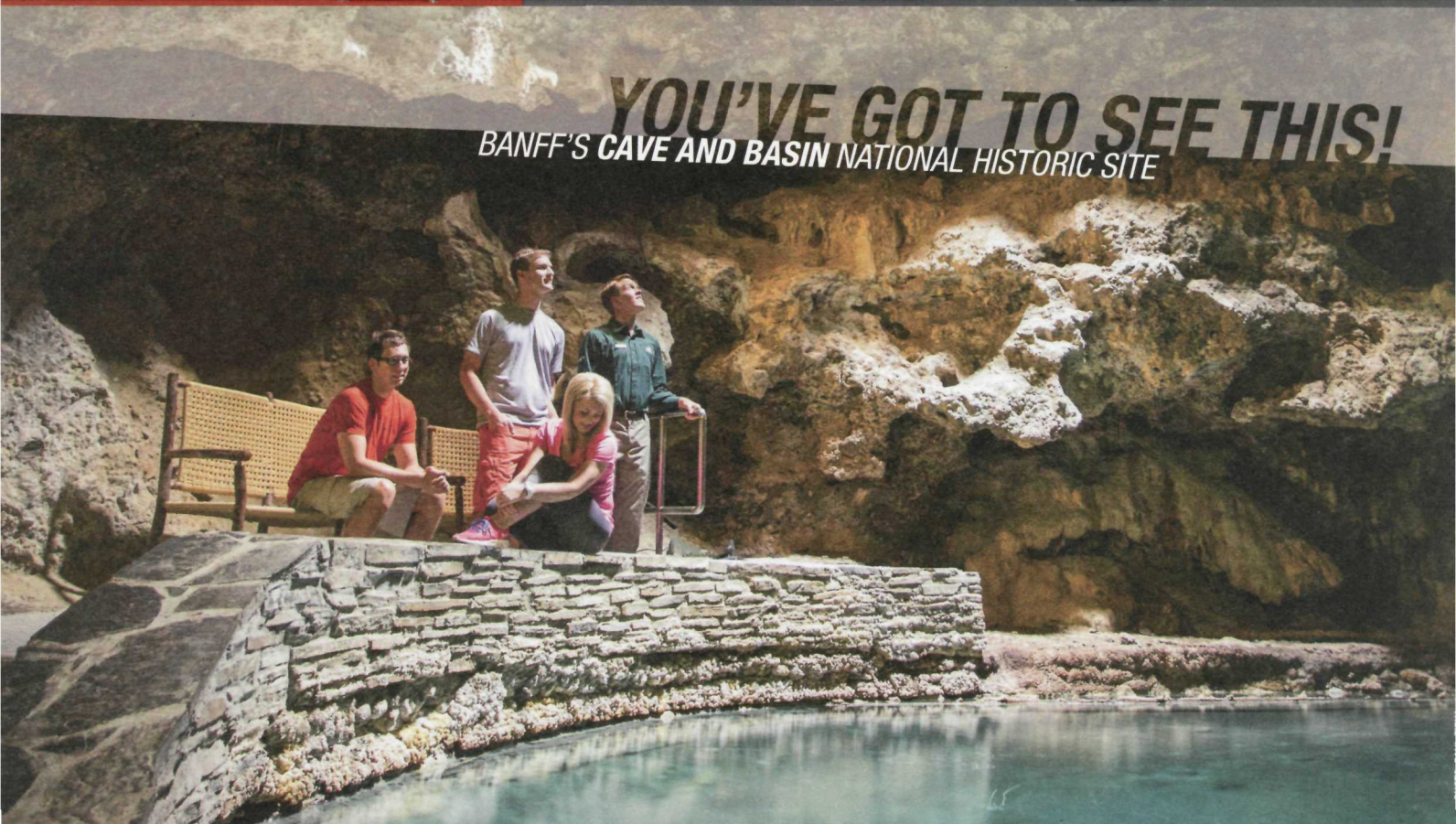


A premier destination nestled within 6,641 sq kms of mountain awe. It's the quintessential mountain playground for hiking, biking and camping.

WATERTON LAKES NATIONAL PARK

TIME TRAVEL

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HOUSE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE



Walk in the footsteps of
Aboriginal Peoples, Fur Traders

Highlights: Explore the peaceful 7 km of nature trails, play in a miniature fort, and marvel at a heritage bison herd. Kayak in the North Saskatchewan river and indulge the imagination at four authentic fur trading post locations. Tipi and trapper tent camping is available.

BAR-U-RANCH NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE



Ranching history comes alive here!
