# Salmon Science at the Cannery

#### Join us on October 6th



On Saturday, October 6th, spend the day exploring, experimenting, and investigating—it's on us!

2018 is a dominant year for the Fraser River Sockeye. More salmon will return to the Fraser River this year than in the past 3 years. They will all pass right by Steveston on

their way to spawn in the streams where they were born. We don't know yet how many will be swimming by, but Mike Lapointe, the Pacific Salmon Commission's chief biologist is quoted in the *Richmond News* (Aug 2, 2018): "This year could see as many as 22.9 million sockeye come up the Fraser (a 25 per cent chance) or as few as 5.2 million (a 10 per cent chance)". The large range got me thinking... How does the Pacific Salmon Commission make these estimates?

Media outlets are also reporting that the warm water temperature of the Fraser River could hamper the spawning success of the fish that do return. That also got me thinking... How warm is too warm for salmon? What do salmon need to survive? What other factors might limit the success of this year's run?

We've got a lot of questions so on the afternoon of October 6th from 1-3 p.m. the Fraser River Discovery Centre will be coming to the Cannery to help us get some answers. Together we will learn more about the needs of Fraser River salmon with water testing and other scientific investigations.

Note: October 6th is our Parks Canada Free Admission Day at the Cannery! Bring your friends and family and enjoy a beautiful day in Steveston!

# Library and Archives Upgrade Project and Open House

Our Library and Archives spaces have been given a facelift!

For those of you who did not know, our Society maintains a Library and an Archives that can normally be found in two small rooms in the Administration building. However, after plans to renovate the Admin building were confirmed last year, it was decided that these collections should be packed up and temporarily moved until work on the building is completed. Not only has this plan has allowed us to ensure that the collections remain protected and undamaged during the work, it has also provided us with the perfect opportunity to fix up the Library and Archives storage spaces.



Thanks to funding from the G&F Financial Group Foundation, we were able to purchase brand new custom shelving for the Archives. This shelving increases storage capacity by approximately 25%, providing more space for the collection to grow in future. In order

to create a fresh surface for the new shelving, the walls in this room were cleaned and painted.

In the Library the shelving remains the same, though other improvements have been made to create a space that is much more pleasant and user friendly. The walls in this room have also been freshly



painted, and new vinyl plank flooring has replaced the old dusty carpet. To provide more lighting and allow staff to see when someone is using the space, a new window was installed on the interior wall between the Library and the main Admin office area.

# New Program: Save Our Salmon

We are excited to introduce a new school program based on an actual historical event that has affected the fishing community of Steveston. The disaster at Hell's Gate BC in 1913-1914, where blasting has blocked the Fraser River, has resulted in millions of sockeye being unable to spawn, affecting the salmon population at the mouth of the lower Fraser. Students will examine

the consequences of this event, taking on the roles of special interest groups in a mock commission, and use their reasoning and problem-solving skills to come up with a plan to *Save Our Salmon*.
