This project started out as a simple listing of lockmasters on the Rideau Canal. There were various lists and pieces of information regarding lockmasters in files and reports, and a few of the lockstations had complete lists of their lockmasters. This list is still not complete – hopefully as new records are opened in the national archives the missing information will come to light.

The following lists of lockmasters are complete for their respective lockstations:

Smiths Falls Combined Chaffeys Upper Brewers Kingston Mills

The rest of the lists are incomplete in some area. The years that are blank are generally between 1940 and 1980, although there are a few blanks before and after.

As I worked on completing the lists, I ran across many names of lockstaff at various points in the canal's history. Because the information was there and it seemed a shame to lose it, I have included a partial list of lockstaff for every lockstation. These lists are <u>very</u> incomplete; however they will provide a starting point for a future research project, should the canal ever wish to undertake listing all lock staff.

At the end of the lists is a short memo from the Superintending Engineer in 1932 laying out "the duties of the Seasonal men" for the season of 1932-33.

Note about dates: For both the lockmasters and the lockstaff, when a date range is given [eg 1930-56] these are inclusive dates. When dates are separated with a comma [1930, 1935] this means that evidence was found that showed the person to have been in the position for both those years, but no evidence was found for the years between. This does not mean that they were not staff on the Rideau in the intervening years – they may have been – but no evidence was found.

From the Superintending Engineer June 22, 1933 RG 43 Vol 1527 file 8791 pt. 11 In 1932-33 the duties of the Seasonal men were as follows:

"Ottawa

There are 8 locks in flight at this station, with six lockmen and a lockmaster, and their duties are as follows. Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4 come on duty at 7:00 a.m., and at 6:00 p.m. Nos. 5 and 6 come on relieving Nos. 1 and 2. Next morning Nos. 1 and 2 come back at 7:00 a.m., relieving Nos. 3 and 4, who have been on for 24 hours. Then at 6:00p.m. Nos. 3 and 4 come on again relieving Nos. 5 and 6 who have been on duty 24 hours and so on, so that there are always 4 men on duty for the we hours, each man serving continuously for 24 hours with 12 hours off between changes.

Although we provide sleeping quarters, there are no cooking facilities at the Ottawa Lock House, and the men who are on continuously require at least one hot meal during that time and most of them live at considerable distances from the Lock House rendering it very difficult for their families to bring their meals to them. We could manage with one man less but this would leave the reliefs farther apart, but a cook stove would be necessary in the Lock House.

At present the men have little work outside day and night lockings, except in loading scow from the Storehouse with timber, plank, cement, etc., for conveyance by out boats along the Canal, the cutting of grass and the care of flower beds being attended to by a gardener, whose services could be dispensed with and this work done by the Lockmen and Storemen between them,. The Lockmaster, in addition to his duties as such, has a considerable amount of clerical work, and is also employed as Storekeeper, and Canal Clerk to issue Let passes, and make out Ships' Transports, Water Measurements and returns to the Bureau of Statistics, and his time is fully occupied.

Hartwells

Here there are 2 locks in flight, and considerable locking. The Lockmaster has 2 lockmen under him, who cut the grass, do the painting of structures and all other necessary work. Our timber pond is here where we keep our dimension timber inside a boom.

Hogsback

Two locks n flight, a hand operated Swing Bridge and 2 waste Weirs with a large number of stoplogs. Lockmaster has 2 lockmen who have to keep grass cut and station tidy, do painting, etc. A large station and one extremely difficult to regulate as to highway traffic, swimming, etc., so that I have applied to the Department for R.C. M. Police assistance to the Lock officials

Black Rapids

A single Lock with no Swing Bridge, but the Lockmaster has one Lockman to assist him as locking as at times heavy. Large areas of greass to cut, stoplogs and flashboards on the Long Dam to adjust and painting, etc.

Long Island

Three locks in flight, one hand operated Swing Bridge, a large Waste Weir at the Lock Stations, a Stoplog Dam about 1 ¹/₂ miles above the Lock and a large Dam and Waste Weir at Manotick nearly 3 ¹/₂ miles away, all under the care of the Lockmaster who has 2 Lockmen to assist him and who has constantly to be away at the Manotick Dam to regulate the Water Supply. Their time is fully occupied.

Burritts Rapids

Single lock, Lockmaster has one Lockman to assist him. The regulation dam is 1 ½ miles form the Lock so that he frequently has to go there to adjust stoplogs, leaving his lockman in charge of the Lock. There is a large area of grass to be kept out and painting, etc., and keeping the station clean.

Nicholson's

Two detached Locks 1/3 of a mile apart, with one hand-operated Swing Bridge. Lockmaster has 2 Lockmen to assist him, as the Locks cannot be operated with fewer, as one man has to be at the Upper Lock to unwater to fill the Cut and the Lower Lock and prepare the Upper Lock and swing the Bridge. Also grass cutting and painting, etc.

Clowes

Single Lock, no Bridge. Lockmaster has one Lockman, whose services might be dispensed with if considered advisable by Department. The stoplogs, however, in the Waste Weir are very long and heavy and cannot be lifted by one man alone.

Merrickville

A large station with three detached locks with 2 intervening Basins, and one handoperated Swing Bridge, and two Waste Weirs. Lockmaster has 2 Lockmen, and the Station cannot be operated with fewer. The men are employed also cutting grass, painting when required, etc.

Kilmarnock

Single Lock with 1 hand-operated Swing Bridge and long Waste Weir. Lockmaster has one Lockman to assist. He has to attend to the Back Dam also, which is 2 ½ miles away from his station. The usual grass cutting, etc., and other small work is done be the two.

Edmond's

Single Lock, no Bridge. Lockmaster is alone here.

Old Sly's

Two Locks in flight and one hand-operated Swing Bridge and Waste Weir. Lockmaster has one Lockman to assist in the usual work as outlined in the foregoing.

Smiths Falls Combined

Three Locks in flight, on hand-operated Swing Bridge, one Waste Weir and one fixed Bridge. Lockmaster has two lockmen assisting,. He also acts as Canal Clerk (with \$400.00 per annum extra salary, and which might be reduced to \$100.00 per annum, as collections are now made direct to the Department) and he would still have to issue Let passes, Etc. The usual work is also done by the Lockmen.

Smiths Falls Detached

Single Lock, one hand-operated Swing Bridge and one separate Fixed Bridge, with regulating Waste Weir. Lockmaster has one Lockman to assist, and as he has to be away on water control work quite frequently, one man has to be left in charge. The usual work of grass cutting, etc., is also done be the two.

Poonamalie

Single Lock, no Bridge. Lockmaster has to be away every day to attend to water flow from Rideau lake, and to the Automatic Gauge, the latter and Waste Weir being nearly a mile away from the Lock. He h as two Lockmen to assist him, and as there is a very large number of lockages here as well as the other usual work, these two men are really necessary.

Narrows

Single Lock, with hand operated Swing Bridge and Waste Weir. Lockmaster has one Lockman to assist, who might be dispensed with if decided by the Department.

Newboro

Single Lock, no Swing Bridge, but one High Level Fixed Bridge. No Waster Weir. Lockmaster has one Lockman but as there is a great deal of locking here, I consider that he requires this man.

Chaffey's

Single Lock, with hand-operated Swing Bridge, and Waste Weir. Lockmaster has one Lockman who is required on account of the large amount of locking, etc.

Davis'

Single lock, no Swing Bridge. Lockmaster has one Lockman to assist him, and who might be dispensed with if so decided by the Department.

Jones' Falls

One detached Lock, Basin and three Locks in fight, one hand-operated Swing Bridge, one Fixed Bridge and one Waste Weir. Lockmaster has four Lockmen here, two at the upper Lock to run water and pass the boats and then follow down to the three Locks and Swing Bridge, as well as cut grass and keep this large station clean and tidy lockmaster also has charge of Morton Dam, three miles distant, which he has to visit frequently for water control. One man cut off this year.

Brewers Mills

Two locks in flight, one hand-operated Swing Span and one Waste Weit. Lockmaster has one Lockman to assist.

Washburn

Single Lock and hand-operated Swing Bridge, also Waste Weir. Lockmaster has one Lockman to assist him, and whose services might be dispensed with if decided by the department.

Kingston Mills

One detached Lock, one Basin and three Locks in flight. One hand-operated Swing Bridge and one separate Fixed Bridge. Lockmaster has five Lockmen to assist him, and he also acts as Canal Clerk, at an extra salary of \$400.00 per annum, which could be reduced to \$100.00 per annum as collections are now made direct to the Department, but he would still have to issue Let passes etc. One Lockman also could be dispensed with at this Station."
