


Welcome to ELK ISLAND NATIONAL PARK!

The activities will be easier and more fun to do with an adult. Show him/her your book to **get started on your first challenge!**



- See a film about Elk Island's bison at the Astotin Theatre!






TAKE A LOOK

The Bison Loop is a great place to see plains bison. Hop in the car for some of the best wildlife viewing around!





LEAVE IT TO BEAVERS



Beavers are everywhere in the park and the best way to find them is to look for their houses. Beavers use mud and branches to build houses called lodges. Find a lodge along the road or on a trail and draw the outside. Then imagine what it looks like inside.





USE YOUR SENSES

THE SOUNDS AROUND

Nature is noisy! Listen to the sounds around you.

- 1. Find a spot outside where you can sit or stand.



See if you can spot these constellations.





CHECK IT OUT




