



Who kept their feet in the water the longest?



Act out hiking and camping words without making any sound (like playing charades). Get your family to guess the words. Let everyone have a turn at acting out a word—and see who can guess the most!




TAKE A LOOK

Tachäl Dhal is a mountain in Kluane that is home to a large number of Dall Sheep (may).


How many sheep do you see in the displays and on the mountain?


HIT THE TRAIL

Xplore a piece of the original Alaska Highway. Imagine what it would have been like to drive through the wilderness along this narrow, windy and rarely used road.










