

BARK IN THE PARK



COOK IT!

A TASTE OF TRADITION

Aboriginal people have a tradition of making bannock. Try your hand at making this simple bread at your next campfire or even at one of our interpretative programs. It tastes great with some butter and jam.



Add milk to dry ingredients a little at a time and mix until dough is soft and ready to work without sticking to your hands. Roll small pieces into ropes about 30 cm long. Carefully wrap around a hot dog stick. Hold over the coals, away from flames. Turn it and cook until it is an even toasty brown. Mmmmm!


