


The Sault Ste. Marie Canal is home to the world's first electrically operated lock! Sault Ste. Marie is right in the middle of two Great Lakes – Lake Superior and Lake Huron. Lake Superior is 6.98m higher than Lake Huron, so we use a lock to let boats pass through from one lake to the other. It's like an elevator for boats!

BOAT TALK


Go to the Visitor Centre to collect the materials to make a signal flag necklace!

Boats use signal flags to talk to each other. Each flag represents a letter (or number) but also a message. For example, the signal flag that is half vellow, half red, split down the middle diagonally can mean "Man overboard" by itself, or the letter "O" when used together with other flags to spell a word. 
HOW A LOCK WORKS






I SPY WITH MY LITTLE EYE...




BIG HUNK OF STEEL

Go check out the big orange steel structure at the west end of the site! It's called the Emergency Swing Dam and is famous for saving the day during the accident of 1909. Its name tells you what it does: in an emergency it swings across the canal, the wickets are lowered and the shutters drop down to block the water and make a dam!

Step back in time and play a game that children who lived in the Superintendent's Residence might have played more than 100 years ago!




- One player stands at the end of the lawn with their back turned to the other players. The other players will move towards this first player.


