The Schoenck are not mentioned as they reside within the limits of S York at Fort Hunter & Onondaga part of the Onondaga Country lies also within that Province. The Tuscaroras who form the sixth Nation are omitted being a southern People that live on lands allotted between Onondaga & Onondaga*
