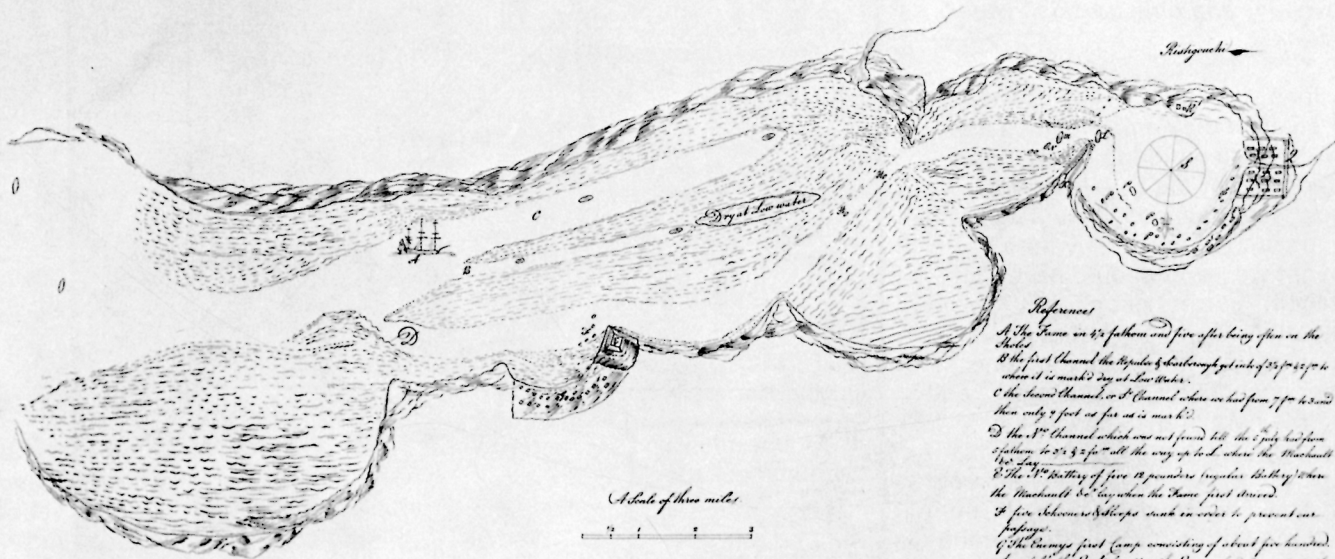


A Draft of the upper part of Chaleur Bay, called Restigouche, in the Gulf of St. Lawrence.

A The Trench on 1/2 fathom and five after being often on the bottom.

B The first Channel the Regulus & Scarborough got out of 3/4 fms or 45 fms when it is marked by a low water.

C The second Channel, or 1st Channel where we had from 7 fms to 10 and then only 2 feet or far as it is marked.

D The 1st Channel which was not found till the 3rd July had from 1 fathom to 2 1/2 fms all the way up to where the Hancock lay.

E The 1st Battery of five 18 pounders (regular Battery) when the Hancock lay when the same first struck.

F Five schooners & frigates sunk in order to prevent our progress.

G The Encampment consisting of about five hundred tents by the English after the Enemy had evacuated the 3rd inst.

H A steep bank in the narrow.

I The marine Battery of three nine pounders, covered by a breast Work and many small items.

K The upper 1st Battery on Restigouche of 7 1/2 and 9 pounders & the Hancock of 30 Guns 18, 22 pounders of a ship.

M N O P The Regulus, Scarborough & Chatham (sunk).

Q R S T The Rattlesnake, Marine Malaga, and all the small Craft which were destroyed.

U The Camps consisting of 1000 Regulars, Canadians and savages.

V A Church and a Breche Road on 1st point of the Bay on Lake Restigouche.
